

**WAGNER, Sallie, of Santa Fe, New Mexico**, passed away August 30, 2006 at the age of 93.

She was born in Wheeling, W. Va., June 7, 1913, the daughter of the late Dwight H. Wagner and Elsie Whitaker Wagner.

Sallie graduated from National Cathedral High School and received her degree in Anthropology from the University of Chicago.

Sallie had a life long interest in the Southwest and its people. She owned and operated Wide Ruins and Pine Springs Trading Posts on the Navajo reservation in Arizona from 1938-1950. She then moved to Santa Fe and remained there the rest of her life.

She was very active in the community, supporting many individuals and organizations. Sallie's philanthropy was recognized and rewarded many times and in 1990, she was designated Santa Fe's Living Treasure.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Nelson W. Wagner; and her sister, Elsie W. Wardman.

She is survived by her niece, Firth Waldon and her husband, Colin Waldon; niece, Suzanne Gordon; nephew, Whitaker Wagner; and numerous great-nieces, great-nephews, and cousins.

A Memorial service was held in Santa Fe, September 30, 2006.
